While direct exposure to high-powered fiber optic light can potentially harm the cornea or lens, the risk to the general public is extremely low because the light is contained within the cables and distribution boxes . Only trained personnel using specialized equipment should handle exposed fiber ends, and looking directly into a fiber without proper precautions is discouraged .

Fiber optic distribution boxes are designed to maintain network integrity while minimizing signal loss. They organize and protect fiber splices, connectors, and splitters, preventing damage from environmental factors such as moisture, dust, and temperature extremes . Properly installed boxes ensure stable broadband, TV, and telephone services without posing hazards to passersby .
