For glow-in-the-dark applications, this means the surface may become rough or slightly discolored if not protected. Using a UV-stabilized resin or coating can help maintain both the structural integrity and the visual appearance of the glow effect.

Practical Considerations

- o Cutting and bonding: Ultra-fine fiberglass sheets are easy to cut with scissors or razor knives and can be adhered to surfaces using high-performance adhesives .
- o Charging: The glow effect requires exposure to light, preferably UV or bright visible light, to recharge the phosphors .
- o Abrasion: Fiberglass can be abrasive, so handling with care is recommended to avoid scratching the surface, which could reduce glow efficiency.
- o Applications: These materials are suitable for decorative panels, signage, or artistic projects where a subtle glow is desired without compromising the look in daylight .
