

Average outer diameter of optical cable

The standard outer diameter of optical cables typically ranges from 2 mm to 3 mm for indoor cables and 4 mm to 20 mm for outdoor or high-fiber-count cables.

Indoor Optical Cables

Outdoor Optical Cables

Outdoor cables, including loose-tube designs for long-distance or rugged environments, have larger diameters to accommodate multiple fibers, protective jackets, and environmental shielding. Typical outer diameters range from 4 mm to 20 mm, with subunits often standardized at around 2.2 mm for individual fiber bundles . The diameter increases with fiber count, armor layers, and additional insulation for moisture and UV protection .

Fiber-to-the-Home (FTTH) Drop Cables

FTTH drop cables are lightweight and flexible, designed for last-mile connectivity. Their outer diameters generally range from 2 mm to 3 mm, similar to indoor cables, but optimized for easy routing through walls and conduits .

Factors Affecting Outer Diameter

The overall cable diameter depends on several factors:

- o Fiber count: More fibers require larger bundles and thicker jackets.
- o Buffering type: Tight-buffered fibers are smaller and more flexible, while loose-tube fibers are larger to allow thermal expansion.
- o Protective layers: Jackets, armor, and insulation increase the diameter.
- o Application environment: Outdoor cables require thicker jackets for durability, while indoor cables prioritize flexibility .
