Structure and Design

Bundle-shaped pigtails consist of multiple optical fibers arranged in a flat ribbon, typically 2 to 12 fibers per ribbon, with a factory-terminated connector on one end and a bare or ribbonized fiber end for splicing into a larger cable. The ribbon structure allows simultaneous mass fusion splicing, where all fibers in the ribbon can be spliced at once, improving efficiency and reducing signal loss. Protective tubes or fanout sleeves are often used to separate individual fibers at the connector end, ensuring durability and easier handling.

Applications

These pigtails are widely used in Optical Distribution Frames (ODFs), termination boxes, cabinets, and enclosures, particularly in high-density network environments such as data centers and telecommunications networks. They are ideal for single-mode (G657A1/A2) and multimode (OM1-OM5) fibers, supporting both long-distance and high-bandwidth applications. Ribbon pigtails simplify the termination of high-count fiber cables, allowing multiple fibers to be connected efficiently to patch panels or transceivers.
