- 4. Cable Management and Protection** Maintain proper bend radius (ideally 1 cm or more) to prevent signal loss. Use wall boxes, trunking, or protective sleeves to organize and secure excess fiber. Avoid sharp bends, pinching, or folding, as fiber optic cables are more fragile than copper cables .
- 5. Testing and Verification** After relocation, test the fiber connections using optical power meters or visual fault locators to ensure signal integrity. Verify that all connections are secure and that the network is functioning correctly before finalizing the installation .
- 6. Professional Installation Considerations** Due to the delicate nature of fiber optics, engaging trained professionals is recommended. They can handle fusion splicing, mechanical splices, and precise cable routing to prevent damage and maintain optimal performance .
