

Distance between cable tray angle iron brackets

Preview

Make the holes and fix the cable tray supports with appropriate metal plugs, mounting brackets with base plates and nuts, 'L' angles / slotted 'C' channels and nuts. 2 meter distance is maintained between the supports to avoid sagging of cable trays / ladders. Cable ladder systems and cable tray systems shall be manufactured in accordance with BS EN 61537, channel support. Although BS 7671 touches on the subject of cable supports, it does not detail specifically what these support distances should be. 8 (Other Mechanical Stresses (AJ)) in that document provides requirements for cable support. Metal cable tray systems for power communications cabling shall be installed in accordance with NECA/NEMA 105, Standard for Installing Metal Cable Tray Systems (ANSI).

Cable tray length is selected based on the load to be supported, the distance between the supports (also referred to as the span), and handling and installation constraints.
