Proper installation, including avoiding narrow gaps where moisture can accumulate, is critical to prevent contact corrosion.

Cable trays and their supports may be subject to IP ratings for dust and water ingress, but these ratings typically apply to the tray enclosure rather than the support hardware. For outdoor or industrial installations, engineers evaluate additional loads and environmental risks, ensuring that supports are made of suitable materials and finishes to maintain long-term integrity.
