- o Maintain a tight seal without visible cracks or voids; gaps should generally not exceed 1 cm² .
- o Fireproof putty can be used in new construction or retrofits, and it is compatible with various wall types, including concrete and gypsum .
- o Additional firestop measures, such as waterstops at slab penetrations, may be required for floor-level trays .

Alternative or Complementary Firestopping

Other fire-rated materials, such as firestop mastic, mineral wool, or fire-rated boards, can also be used depending on the system design and UL-listed firestop assemblies . The choice of material should comply with local building codes and UL or FM-approved systems.
