Use Dust Caps

Always cover unused fiber optic coupler ports with adapter dust caps. These caps form a seal that prevents dust, moisture, and debris from entering the coupler, protecting the sensitive fiber end-faces and maintaining signal integrity. Different connector types (LC, SC, FC, MT) require matching dust caps to ensure a snug fit and effective protection.

Proper Handling

- o Hold by the connector housing: Avoid touching the fiber end-face, as oils and sweat from your fingers can transfer to the connector and degrade performance.
- o Minimize open exposure: Keep connectors capped when not in use, and avoid leaving ports exposed in dusty environments.
- o Clean-as-you-go policy: Inspect and clean connectors before mating, even if they appear new or previously used.

Cleaning Techniques

- o Dry cleaning: Use cassette cleaners, fiber cleaning sticks, or reel-type cleaners to remove dust without introducing moisture or solvents.
- o Wet-dry cleaning: For stubborn contaminants, apply fiber optic cleaning fluid followed by a dry wipe, ensuring no residue remains.
- o Inspection: Use a fiber inspection microscope (at least 200x magnification) to verify cleanliness before connecting.

Environmental Considerations

- o Control dust exposure: Install couplers in clean, enclosed panels or cabinets, especially in high-density patch fields or industrial environments.
- o Avoid moisture and residue: Keep connectors away from high humidity or condensation, and use fiber-safe cleaning materials to prevent lint or residue buildup.

Storage and Transport

- o Store unused connectors and dust caps in sealed containers to prevent contamination during shipping or
