Regulatory Requirements

Cable trays carrying conductors rated over 600 volts must be marked with "DANGER -- HIGH VOLTAGE -- KEEP AWAY" at intervals no greater than 10 feet, according to the NEC 392.18(H) and section 110.21(B) of the 2014 NEC(R) . Labels must comply with ANSI Z535.4-2011 standards, specifying font, color, symbols, and capitalization to effectively warn personnel of hazards . Exceptions exist for inaccessible equipment in industrial settings where only qualified personnel perform maintenance.
