- o Lifecycle Management: Assessing cables for replacement or upgrades when approaching the end of their design life (typically 15-20 years) or when network speeds increase .

Maintenance teams must follow strict safety protocols:

- o Avoid inspecting live high-speed links with microscopes or high-power lasers, as concentrated light can damage eyes .
