Code violation alert: Fire sprinkler piping is not a cable pathway. Zip-tying or wrapping low-voltage cabling (data, access control, alarm, video) onto active sprinkler lines violates NFPA and NEC intent, creates hazards, and can fail an AHJ inspection. Low voltage wiring operates at 50 volts or less and is used for data, security, entertainment, and control systems, differing fundamentally from the 120-volt wiring that powers outlets and lights.
