- o Circuit Breakers: Protect individual circuits by automatically cutting off power during overloads or short circuits. Types include:
 - o 1P (Single Pole): Controls only the live wire, suitable for simple circuits .
 - o 1P+N (Single Pole + Neutral): Protects both live and neutral wires.
 - o 2P (Double Pole): Controls and isolates both live and neutral wires, ideal for high-safety circuits .
- o Bus Bars: Conductive strips (copper or aluminum) that distribute power from the main switch to individual breakers .
- o Leakage Protectors: Protect against electric shocks, especially in socket circuits .
- o Overvoltage/Undervoltage Protection: Safeguards the system from voltage fluctuations .
- o Indication Lights: Show the status of mains power supply .

Circuit Layout Considerations

For safety and efficiency, circuits are typically organized as follows :

- o Room Socket Circuits: Each room has its own circuit to isolate electrical issues.
- o High-Power Appliance Circuits: Dedicated circuits for appliances like stoves, air conditioners, and water heaters to prevent overloading.
- o Lighting Circuits: Separate circuits for lighting to maintain stable operation.
