- o Physical Size: More ways require larger enclosures to house additional breakers safely .
- o Load Considerations: The total electrical load and diversity of connected devices must be calculated to prevent overloads and ensure safety .
- o Future Expansion: It is recommended to leave extra space for additional circuits to accommodate future appliances or upgrades .

While technically some industrial boards can support over 70 circuits, most residential and small commercial distribution boxes range from 4 to 36 circuits. Choosing the right board depends on current load, safety requirements, and potential future expansion .
