

How thick should the fire-retardant coating be on the cable tray

The thickness of a cable tray after applying a fire-retardant coating depends on the coating type and design specifications, typically ranging from 100 to 250 microns (0.1-0.25 mm) per layer, verified against national safety standards.

Coating Application and Thickness

Fire-retardant coatings are applied to cable trays to increase heat resistance and prevent flame propagation . The process generally involves:

- o Surface preparation: Cleaning, rust removal, and priming to ensure proper adhesion.
- o Primer application: A corrosion-resistant primer is applied uniformly.
- o Fire-retardant coating: Applied via spraying, rolling, or brushing, with thickness controlled to meet design and safety standards.
- o Topcoat (optional): Provides weather resistance and durability. The total thickness after coating depends on the number of layers and the type of coating used. Most industrial standards recommend a single layer of 100-150 microns, with some high-performance coatings requiring additional layers up to 250 microns .

Inspection and Verification

After coating, the tray thickness is measured using calibrated devices to ensure compliance with project specifications and national safety standards. Inspections check for:

- o Uniformity of coating
- o Absence of cracks, peeling, or bubbles
- o Proper adhesion using cross-cut or pull-off tests

Practical Considerations

- o Mechanical clearance: Adding a coating slightly increases tray dimensions, so ensure that the extra thickness does not interfere with cable installation or tray fittings.
- o Heat dissipation: Coatings can affect airflow; perforated or mesh trays are recommended to maintain heat dissipation .
- o Maintenance: Periodic inspection ensures the coating remains intact and effective over time . In summary, while the exact thickness varies by coating type and project requirements, expect an increase of approximately 0.1-0.25 mm per layer, and always verify against the relevant standards and specifications during installation and inspection .
