

How to connect a Cat6e network panel to a fiber optic cable

- o **Distance and Bandwidth:** Single-mode fiber is suitable for long distances, while multimode is for shorter runs. Cat6e supports Gigabit Ethernet, which is compatible with most media converters .
- o **Avoid Cable Damage:** Keep fiber cables free from sharp bends and ensure connectors are clean to prevent signal loss .
- o **Future-Proofing:** Consider using Cat6a or Cat7 if planning for 10G connections, as they provide higher
