



How to connect a K66 router to fiber optic internet

To connect a K66 router to fiber optic internet, use an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) to convert the fiber signal, then link it to the router's WAN port via Ethernet and configure the router with your ISP credentials.

- o Access the K66 router's admin panel via a web browser (typically at 192.168.1.1 or 192.168.0.1).
- o Enter your ISP-provided credentials (username, password, and connection type if required).
- o Update the router firmware if prompted.
- o Configure Wi-Fi settings, including SSID and password, and enable security protocols like WPA3 for optimal protection.
- o Optionally, enable Quality of Service (QoS) to prioritize traffic for gaming, video calls, or streaming .

Step 5: Verify the Connection

- o Check the ONT and router status lights: the ONT should show a solid power and link light, and the router should indicate WAN connectivity.
- o Test internet access on a connected device to ensure proper functionality.
- o Adjust router placement for optimal Wi-Fi coverage, keeping it in a dry, ventilated area near a power source
