



How to connect a fiber optic cable to a router two-prong plug

You cannot plug a fiber optic cable directly into a standard router; it must first connect to an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), which then links to your router via Ethernet.

Step 1: Gather Your Equipment

- o Fiber optic cable: Usually thin, yellow, with SC/APC or SC/UPC connectors. Handle carefully to avoid dirt or damage .
- o Optical Network Terminal (ONT): Converts the fiber's light signals into electrical signals your router can use .
- o Router: Ensure it has a WAN or Internet port compatible with Ethernet input.
- o Ethernet cable: Typically Cat6 or higher for optimal speed.
- o Power adapters: For both the ONT and router.

Step 2: Connect the Fiber to the ONT

- o Locate the fiber wall outlet where your ISP's line enters your home.
- o Remove protective caps from both the fiber cable and the ONT's optical port.
- o Align the fiber connector with the ONT port using the key/tab on the connector.
- o Push gently until it clicks into place, ensuring a secure connection .

Step 3: Power the ONT

- o Plug in the ONT using its power adapter (often a two-prong plug).
- o Wait 2-5 minutes for the status lights to stabilize, indicating the ONT is ready .

Step 4: Connect the ONT to Your Router

- o Use an Ethernet cable to connect the ONT's LAN/Ethernet port to the router's WAN/Internet port .
- o Power on the router and wait for the indicator lights to confirm a successful connection.

Step 5: Verify and Configure

- o Check that the Power and Internet lights on both devices are solid green.
- o Access your router's settings via a web browser if manual configuration is required by your ISP .

Tips for Safe Handling

- o Avoid bending or twisting the fiber cable sharply.



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- o Keep connectors clean; dust or fingerprints can degrade signal quality.
- o Place both ONT and router in a dry, ventilated area near electrical outlets . Following these steps ensures a stable, high-speed fiber connection from your ISP to your home network.
