

How to connect a router to a fiber optic line

- o Check that the ONT and router lights indicate a stable connection .
 - o For larger homes, consider mesh Wi-Fi devices to extend coverage .
 - o Handle fiber cables carefully and keep the ONT and router in a dry, ventilated area near power outlets .
