Understanding Your Distribution Box

A distribution box, also called a breaker box, consumer unit, or panelboard, is the central hub where incoming electrical supply is split into multiple circuits, each protected by its own breaker or RCBO. Inside, you will find busbars, neutral and earth bars, MCBs, RCDs, and sometimes surge protection devices. Each breaker controls a specific circuit, such as a room, appliance, or outdoor outlet, and may be labeled to indicate its load .

- o **Safety First:** Always turn off the main power switch before opening the panel. Wear insulated gloves and safety glasses to prevent electrical hazards .
- o **Check Existing Labels:** Look for any labels on the breakers. Clear, durable labels (vinyl or polyester) help identify circuits quickly. If labels are missing or unclear, plan to update them .
- o **Use a Circuit Tester or Finder:** A circuit breaker finder or voltage tester can help determine which breaker controls a specific outlet or fixture. Plug the tester into an outlet and follow the instructions to trace the corresponding breaker .
- o **Trace Outgoing Lines:** Open the panel and visually inspect the outgoing wires. Each wire typically runs to a specific area or appliance. Understanding the load and protection method of each circuit helps in identification .
- o **Test Room by Room:** Turn off one breaker at a time and check which lights, outlets, or appliances lose power. Record the results to create an accurate map of your circuits .
- o **Label and Document:** Once identified, label each breaker clearly with its corresponding room or appliance. Keep a notepad or digital record for future reference .

- o **Dual Power or Backup Circuits:** If your distribution box has a dual power switch, understand its operation to avoid confusion during testing .
- o **Regular Updates:** Check and update labels periodically, especially after adding new circuits or appliances .
