

How to install cable trays for upstairs

- o Support spacing: Typically 1.5 to 3 meters apart, depending on tray type and load.
- o Mounting options: Use wall brackets, ceiling struts, or threaded rods. For center-hung trays, ensure the maximum load per hanger is not exceeded (around 318-340 kg) and spacing does not exceed 3.6 meters.
- o Leveling: Ensure trays are straight and level to prevent sagging and maintain cable integrity.

Step 4: Install the Trays

- o Connect tray sections using couplers or splice plates.
- o Secure each section to the supports with appropriate clamps or fasteners.
- o Handle trays carefully to avoid coating damage, especially for galvanized or painted surfaces.
- o For bends or elevation changes, use pre-fabricated elbows or riser sections to maintain smooth cable routing.

Step 5: Lay Cables and Finalize

- o Place cables in the tray without exceeding the fill ratio (usually 50% of tray capacity) to prevent overheating.

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- o Use cable ties or straps to secure cables, maintaining separation between power and data lines if required.
- o Ground the tray system according to NEC Article 392 and local electrical codes .
- o Label trays and cables for easy identification and future maintenance.

Step 6: Inspection and Maintenance

- o Inspect the installation for proper alignment, secure mounting, and compliance with code requirements.
- o Periodically check for sagging, loose fasteners, or cable wear, especially in high-traffic or vibration-prone areas . Following these steps ensures a safe, code-compliant, and organized cable tray installation upstairs, facilitating future maintenance and upgrades.
