

How to make an end piece using only a fiber splice tray

Article Overview

You can create an end piece by mechanically splicing or fusion splicing fibers directly into a fiber splice tray, carefully routing and securing the fibers without additional enclosures.

Step-by-Step Process

1. Prepare the Fiber

- o Strip the outer sheath and buffer coating to expose the fiber according to the cable and splicing instructions .
 - o Clean the fiber with isopropyl alcohol to remove any debris or coating residue .
- ### 2. Choose the Splicing Method

- o Mechanical Splicing: Align fibers using a mechanical splice holder; no electricity is required, making it suitable for quick installations .
- o Fusion Splicing: Use a fusion splicer to weld the fiber ends together for a permanent, low-loss connection .

3. Install the Splice Holder in the Tray

- o For mechanical splices, place the plastic splice holders in the tray recess and snap them into place .
 - o For fusion splices, use heat-shrink protection sleeves and position them in the tray organizer .
- ### 4. Route and Coil the Fiber

- o Carefully route the fiber along the tray's designated channels, avoiding sharp bends to prevent signal loss .
 - o Coil any excess fiber neatly in the tray to manage slack and prevent stress on the splice .
- ### 5. Secure the Fiber
- o Use zip ties or clips provided with the tray to hold fibers in place without compressing them .
 - o Ensure fibers are not pinched when closing the tray cover, as compression can degrade transmission .

6. Close the Tray

- o Align the cover properly with the tray tabs and slide or snap it into place, ensuring the fibers remain undisturbed .
- ### 7. Test the Connection

- o Use a visual fault locator (VFL) or optical time-domain reflectometer (OTDR) to verify the splice integrity and check for breaks or excessive loss .

Tips for Success

- o Always follow the manufacturer's instructions for the specific splice tray model.
- o Maintain a minimum bend radius for fibers to avoid microbends.
- o Label fibers if multiple connections are present to simplify future maintenance. By following these steps, a fiber splice tray alone can serve as a functional end piece, providing protection, organization, and reliable fiber connections without additional enclosures .
