

How to use a mobile power distribution box on a construction site

- o Clear labeling and modular connectors for easy setup and reconfiguration .

Construction sites are regulated under NEC Article 590 and OSHA 29 CFR 1926.405, which require that temporary wiring and equipment be rated for site conditions, protected against shock and fire hazards, and removed promptly after use . Key safety measures include:

- o Using ground-fault circuit interrupters (GFCIs) in wet or damp locations.
- o Ensuring all cables and connectors are industrial-grade and waterproof.
- o Regular inspection and maintenance to prevent loose connections or damage .
