

How to wire the main electrical distribution box in the building corridor

Placement and Mounting

When installing a distribution box in a corridor, ensure the wall is structurally sound and free from moisture or high-traffic hazards. The box should be mounted at an accessible height, typically around 1.5 meters, with adequate ventilation and clearance for wiring and maintenance . Use a 35mm DIN rail to secure modular distribution blocks, ensuring it is perfectly level to facilitate proper attachment of the components .

Wiring Components

A standard distribution box includes:

- o Main isolator: Acts as the main switch to open or close the electrical supply.
- o RCCB (Residual Current Circuit Breaker): Protects against current leakage and electric shock.
- o MCBs (Miniature Circuit Breakers): Protect individual circuits from overload or short circuits.
- o Neutral and earth links: Distribute neutral and grounding connections to all circuits .

Wiring Procedure

- o Incoming Supply: Connect the phase and neutral lines from the energy meter to the main isolator.
- o Main Isolator to RCCB: Connect the phase line to the RCCB input; the neutral line goes to the neutral link.
- o RCCB to MCBs: Connect the output of the RCCB to the input of the MCBs. Each MCB then feeds a separate subcircuit.
- o Neutral Distribution: Connect the neutral wires of all output circuits to the neutral link.
- o Earthing: Connect the earth wire from the supply and all circuits to the earth terminal to ensure safety .

Best Practices

- o Strip cables to the recommended length (usually 10-12mm) and use a torque screwdriver to avoid over-tightening or under-tightening, which can cause arcing or heat buildup .
- o Label all circuits clearly for easy identification and future maintenance.
- o Ensure all components comply with local electrical codes and standards (e.g., IEC, NEC, or local regulations) and use certified parts.
- o Perform visual inspections and multimeter tests before powering on to verify correct connections and safety .
- o Consider modular designs for easier future upgrades and maintenance. By following these steps, you can
