Installing British row cabinets requires careful planning, precise measuring, and secure mounting to ensure a level, aligned, and professional finish.

Planning and Preparation

Start by drawing a detailed layout of your kitchen or storage area on graph paper, marking the positions of base, wall, and tall units. Consider the working triangle (sink, hob, fridge) and ensure adequate storage and appliance placement. Check for plumbing, electrical outlets, and ventilation before installation. Tools and Materials

- o Draw a horizontal guideline across the wall using a spirit level.
- o Fix wall brackets securely to the wall, ensuring they align with studs or appropriate anchors.
- o Hang the wall cabinets on the brackets and adjust using internal screws to achieve vertical and horizontal alignment.
- o Check with a spirit level across the top and front face, adjusting as needed .

- o Install face frames, doors, and drawers, ensuring smooth operation.
- o Add crown molding or trim if required, following manufacturer instructions.
- o Apply silicone sealant around sinks, backsplashes, and gaps to prevent water ingress .

Tips for Success

- o Always follow the manufacturer's instructions for your specific cabinet brand.
- o Work from the center outward when aligning multiple cabinets to maintain symmetry.
- o Use temporary clamps and wedges to hold units in place while securing them.
