Electrical Components

- o Main switch or breaker to control the entire supply ()
- o Circuit breakers for individual circuits to prevent overloads ()
- o Residual Current Devices (RCDs) for personal protection against leakage currents ()
- o Busbars, neutral and earth bars for organized connections ()
- o Optional surge protection, smart modules, or time relays for enhanced safety and monitoring ()

Wiring and Cable Management

Ensure all cables are routed neatly and securely. Use cable clamps, luster terminals, or terminal blocks to maintain order and prevent loose connections (). Avoid drilling the housing unnecessarily, as this can compromise waterproofing and dust protection. Use sealing membranes or cable glands to maintain IP integrity ().

Compliance and Safety

Follow local electrical codes and standards, such as DIN VDE 0100 in Germany, which cover protection against electric shock, thermal effects, and testing (). Only qualified electricians should perform installation. Verify that all breakers and fuses are correctly rated for each circuit to prevent overloading and fire hazards ().

Final Checks

Before powering the system:

- o Double-check all connections for tightness and correct placement ()
 - o Ensure surge protection and RCDs are properly installed ()
 - o Confirm the housing is securely closed and sealed to maintain IP protection ()
