

Installation of standard wiring terminals in distribution boxes

- o For three-phase systems, typically use a five-wire system: three-phase lines (A, B, C), one neutral, and one ground .
- o Crimp or screw the wire securely into the terminal to ensure tight contact and good conductivity .

3. Wire Arrangement and Binding

- o Route wires neatly inside the box: main circuit connections on the left, outgoing circuits on the right .
- o Use plastic ties to bind wires, maintaining uniform spacing and straight alignment to prevent tangling and facilitate maintenance .

4. Load-Specific Wiring

- o For 220V loads, connect one phase, one neutral, and one ground wire .
- o For 380V three-phase loads, connect all three phases plus ground; include neutral if local control is required .
- o Special equipment (e.g., two-phase welding machines) may require custom phase connections with grounding .

5. Final Safety Checks

- o Test insulation resistance and circuit continuity to ensure compliance with standards .
- o Verify that breakers, fuses, and other protection devices match the load requirements .
- o Inspect all terminal connections for tightness and proper contact to prevent overheating or electrical faults .

6. Labeling and Documentation

- o Label each terminal and circuit clearly for future maintenance and troubleshooting .
 - o Record installation details, including wire types, breaker ratings, and terminal connections, to comply with safety codes and standards .
