

Installation sequence of secondary distribution box switches

- o Connect neutral and ground: Attach the neutral wire to the neutral bus bar and the ground wire to the grounding bar. In a subpanel, do not bond neutral to ground; this should only occur at the main panel ().
- o Connect outgoing circuits: Wire the outgoing circuits from the switch to the respective branch breakers, keeping wiring neat and organized. Use plastic ties to secure wires and maintain uniform spacing ().
- o Check connections: Ensure all connections are torque-tight and properly insulated to prevent short circuits or overloads ().

Final Steps

- o Label circuits: Clearly mark each circuit for easy identification during maintenance or emergencies ().
- o Safety inspection: Verify that there are no loose connections, exposed wires, or potential hazards before restoring power ().
- o Test the switch: Turn on the main breaker and test the switch to ensure it controls the intended circuits correctly (). Following these steps ensures a safe, compliant, and efficient installation of a switch in a
