Some boxes provide both single-phase and three-phase outputs . **Bus Bars:** Conductive bars that distribute electricity from the main input to multiple circuits efficiently and safely . **Indication Lights:** Visual indicators show the status of mains power and circuit activity, helping operators monitor the system at a glance . **Enclosure:** Typically made from durable materials like thermoplastics, fiberglass, or powder-coated steel, the enclosure is IP-rated (IP44 or higher) to protect against dust, water, and mechanical impacts . **Internal Doors and Panels:** Some boxes include internal doors or panels to separate high-voltage components from accessible areas, enhancing safety . **Optional Features:** Advanced distribution boxes may include energy monitoring units, communication modules, or pre-wired assemblies for quick deployment and remote management .
