In this layer, the layer 2 switches are installed to distribute the data packets to the addressed group of access devices. When planning an enterprise access network, one of the most common dilemmas is whether to deploy Layer 2 (L2) or Layer 3 (L3) switches. A Layer-2 switch works at the Data Link layer or Layer 2 of the OSI reference model.
