A left-facing lighting distribution box is a modular enclosure designed to distribute power and control signals to multiple lighting circuits, with cable entry and outlet orientation suitable for left-side installation.

Overview

A lighting distribution box serves as a central hub for connecting and controlling multiple lighting circuits. Left-facing boxes are typically designed so that the main cable entries, outlets, or control interfaces are oriented to the left, facilitating installation in tight spaces or specific layouts. These boxes can accommodate traditional 230V circuits or modern DALI lighting control systems, making them versatile for both conventional and smart lighting setups (flex7) .

- o Mounting Options: Steel snap-fit clips, machine screws, and supporting brackets enable secure attachment to trunking, cable trays, or standard conduit/BESA boxes, ensuring compliance with wiring regulations .
- o Outlet Capacity: Available in various configurations, such as 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, or 12 outlets, with additional outlets for future expansion .
- o Compatibility: Can work with multiple manufacturers' control devices, including plug-in Klik systems for quick and safe connections without circuit isolation .
- o Safety and Standards: Designed with inaccessible live contacts, earthing connections made first, and rated terminals for safe operation (Hager Klik) .

Installation Considerations

- o Orientation: Ensure the box is mounted so that the left-facing side aligns with the intended cable routing and outlet access.
- o Sealing and Protection: For outdoor or soil installations, some boxes require sealing with supplied compounds to maintain IP68 protection and prevent moisture ingress (BEGA) .
- o Testing: Factory-tested outlets and terminals ensure reliable electrical connections, reducing installation errors and downtime .
