Properly fixing the ends of a cable tray ensures cable security, prevents damage, and maintains system integrity.

End Termination and Protection

When terminating a cable tray, it is important to secure the tray ends with end caps or closure plates to prevent cables from slipping out and to protect them from mechanical damage or sharp edges . For wire mesh or ventilated trays, rounded or insulated end fittings can reduce abrasion on cables and improve safety during maintenance . Solid-bottom trays may require end plates to maintain structural integrity and prevent cable movement .

Mounting and Support

The ends of the tray should be supported using appropriate brackets or hangers. Common methods include:

- o Wall-mounted brackets: Secure the tray end to a wall, keeping it stable and preventing sagging .
- o Ceiling-mounted rods or hangers: Suspend the tray end from the ceiling for elevated installations, ensuring proper alignment with the rest of the tray system .
- o Floor-mounted bases: For heavy-duty or industrial installations, the tray end can be fixed to the floor using surface-mounted brackets .

Ensure that the support spacing near the tray ends is consistent with the manufacturer's recommendations, typically closer than mid-span supports, to handle cable weight and prevent deflection .

Fastening and Accessories

- o Mounting clamps and tray hangers: Use these to secure the tray end firmly to the support structure .
- o Cable tie mounts: Organize cables at the tray end to prevent them from slipping or tangling .
- o End closures: For T-joints or crossovers, ensure that the tray ends are properly fixed with bolts, nuts, or compatible fittings to maintain alignment and load-bearing capacity .

Safety and Standards

All installations should comply with BS EN 61537 for cable tray systems and BS 6946 for channel supports . Only competent personnel familiar with electrical installation practices should perform the work. Properly fixing the ends of the tray not only protects cables but also ensures the system can withstand mechanical loads, including those generated during short circuits or environmental stress .
