CEC Section 12-2200 (6) mandates a 600mm (24 inch) horizontal clearance between cable tray and any wall or obstruction. This requirement applies to industrial and commercial installations where cable trays are installed parallel to walls. In practice, cable tray dimensions are a system of interrelated measurements --width, depth, length, and material thickness--that directly affect cable fill compliance, heat dissipation, structural loading, and long-term expandability.
