Routers for fiber internet typically connect via an ONT, which converts the square SC fiber connector to Ethernet, allowing any high-speed router with gigabit or multi-gigabit WAN ports to work.

Understanding the Connection

Most fiber optic internet setups use a square SC connector to deliver the fiber signal to your home. However, routers rarely have a direct SC fiber port. Instead, the fiber line connects to an ONT (Optical Network Terminal), which converts the optical signal into an Ethernet connection. From there, you can connect a compatible router via its WAN port to distribute internet throughout your home or office .
