

Rust Removal Methods for Galvanized Cable Trays

- o **Environmental Control:** Reduce moisture and chemical exposure in indoor installations. Ensure proper ventilation to prevent condensation and ammonia-related white rust .
- o **Regular Inspection:** Periodically check trays for early signs of rust or coating damage and perform touch-ups promptly.
- o **Material Upgrade:** In highly corrosive environments, consider heavy-duty hot-dip galvanizing, ZnAl/ZnMg alloy trays, or epoxy-coated trays. For extreme conditions, stainless steel (Type 304 or 316) offers long-term corrosion resistance .
