- o Network Architecture: Centralized splitter setups (single high-ratio splitter near the central office) may experience higher loss over long fiber runs, while distributed architectures (secondary splitters closer to end-users) can reduce overall attenuation.

Mitigation Strategies

- o Use high-quality splitters rated for your network's frequency and optical power specifications to minimize loss.
- o Limit the number of cascaded splitters; avoid unnecessary secondary splits if possible.
- o Consider upgrading your internet plan or using a network switch to manage multiple devices more efficiently, reducing the impact of bandwidth sharing.
- o For fiber networks, ensure the optical power budget is sufficient to accommodate additional splitters without dropping below the minimum required signal for reliable operation.
