Recommended Adhesives

- o Polyurethane Adhesives (PU): Products like Sikaflex, Tiger Seal, or PU19 are widely used for bonding splitters to bumpers. They provide strong, flexible adhesion suitable for fibreglass, plastic, or rubber surfaces, and typically require the surfaces to be clean and dry before application. Curing usually takes around 6 hours for initial hold .
- o BMW Betalink Adhesive: For BMW vehicles, Betalink K1 (1K) or K2 (2-part) adhesives are used for securing splitters. K1 is slower curing, while K2 sets faster. These adhesives are designed specifically for automotive plastics and provide long-term durability .
- o 3M VHB Tape: High-strength double-sided tape can be used for lightweight splitters or temporary installations. It is less reliable under high stress or impact but can work for small lip extensions .

Installation Tips

- o Surface Preparation: Clean the bumper and splitter surfaces thoroughly to remove dirt, grease, or old adhesive. Lightly sanding or "keying" the surface can improve adhesion .
- o Alignment: Use a tape measure and marker to center the splitter and mark fixing points. Start fixing from the sides and then the center to maintain alignment .
- o Mechanical Support: If possible, combine adhesive with screws, bolts, or penny washers to provide rigidity, especially for thin or long splitters .
- o Curing: Allow the adhesive to cure undisturbed for the recommended time (usually 6-24 hours depending on the product) before driving .
