

Article Overview

A distribution box safely distributes incoming power to multiple circuits using MCBs, RCCBs, neutral and earth bars, with proper wire sizing, color coding, and protective devices.

Key Components

A standard distribution box includes:

- o Main Circuit Breaker (MCB): Acts as the main switch, typically double-pole for single-phase systems, rated according to total load (e.g., 63A for domestic use) .
- o Residual Current Circuit Breaker (RCCB): Provides protection against leakage currents and electric shocks, usually rated at 30mA for domestic installations .
- o Branch MCBs: Single-pole or double-pole breakers for individual circuits such as lighting, sockets, or air conditioning .
- o Neutral Bar: Distributes the neutral wire to all outgoing circuits .
- o Earth Bar: Connects all protective earth wires to ensure grounding .
- o Busbars and DIN Rails: Facilitate organized mounting and connection of breakers and protective devices .

Wiring Layout

- o Incoming Supply: Connect the phase and neutral wires from the main supply to the input terminals of the main MCB .
- o Main MCB to RCCB: The output of the main MCB is connected to the input of the RCCB to provide overall protection .
- o RCCB to Branch MCBs: The output of the RCCB feeds the branch MCBs, which then supply individual circuits .
- o Neutral Connections: Connect the neutral wires of all branch circuits to the neutral bar .
- o Earth Connections: Connect all earth wires from the circuits and the supply to the earth bar .

Wire Specifications and Color Coding

- o Phase wires: Typically red, yellow, or green depending on the phase (A, B, C) .
- o Neutral wire: Blue .
- o Earth wire: Green/yellow striped .
- o Wire sizing: 2.5mm² for lighting and socket circuits, 4mm² for air conditioning or high-load circuits .

Installation and Safety Practices

- o Arrange breakers from left to right, reserving space for future expansion .

Standard Wiring Distribution Box

- o Keep wiring neat using cable ties and maintain proper spacing .
- o Ensure the distribution box is installed in a dry, ventilated, and accessible location, typically around 1.5 meters above the floor .
- o Label all circuits clearly for easy identification and maintenance .
- o Perform visual inspections and multimeter tests before powering on to check for short circuits or incorrect connections .
- o Follow local electrical codes and standards such as IEC, NEC, or BS 7671 .
