

Article Overview

Standard cable trays are typically finished in neutral colors such as gray, black, or metallic tones, with color often indicating material type or environmental suitability.

Common Color Practices

- o Gray: Most widely used for steel or aluminum cable trays, providing a neutral, corrosion-resistant finish suitable for indoor and general-purpose installations (Hubbell NEXTFRAME(R) Ladder Tray is available in gray) .
- o Black: Often used for aesthetic purposes or in data centers where equipment and trays are color-coordinated .
- o Metallic/Unpainted: Hot-dip galvanized or stainless steel trays retain a metallic finish, indicating corrosion resistance and suitability for harsh or outdoor environments .
- o Special Coatings: Powder-coated or epoxy-coated trays may be used in chemical or highly corrosive environments, sometimes in colors like blue, green, or red to indicate specific cable types or safety zones, though these are typically project-specific rather than standardized .

Material-Based Color Considerations

- o Steel Trays: Usually gray or metallic; galvanized steel may appear silver or light gray.
- o Aluminum Trays: Natural metallic finish or anodized gray for corrosion resistance.
- o Fiberglass/Nonmetallic Trays: Often light gray or beige; color may also indicate UV resistance or flame retardancy .

Standards and Guidelines

- o NEC (NFPA 70) Article 392: Does not mandate specific colors but requires that cable trays be suitable for the environment and clearly identifiable for safety and maintenance purposes .
- o NEMA VE 1 / CSA C22.2 #126.1: Provides guidance on materials and finishes; color is generally used to indicate coating type or corrosion protection rather than electrical function .
- o IEC 61537: International standard for cable tray systems; color is not strictly specified but should not compromise visibility, safety, or identification of cables .

Practical Recommendations

- o Use gray or metallic finishes for general-purpose installations.
- o Reserve black or custom colors for aesthetic or specialized applications.
- o Ensure coatings and colors are compatible with environmental conditions (e.g., UV exposure, chemical

resistance).

o Follow local codes and project specifications, as some facilities may adopt internal color-coding schemes for different cable types (power, data, control). In summary, while there is no universal color code mandated for cable trays, gray, black, and metallic finishes are standard, with other colors applied for environmental protection, aesthetics, or project-specific identification purposes. Compliance with NEC, NEMA, and IEC standards ensures safety and durability.
