- o Inspect Wiring: Look for loose or damaged wires in the distribution box. Ensure all connections are secure and properly seated .
- o Test Voltage: Use a voltmeter to measure voltage at the power supply and at the distribution box to identify where power is lost .
- o Professional Help: If the problem persists, contact a licensed electrician. Do not attempt complex repairs if you are not experienced, as this can be dangerous .
