Attempting to remove or tamper with these components without permission is illegal and unsafe. Always verify local regulations and ensure that any repair or replacement complies with electrical safety

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standards such as BS7671 or equivalent .

Preventive Measures

After repair, maintain the distribution box by:

- o Regularly inspecting for dust, moisture, or corrosion.
- o Ensuring the box is properly sealed and protected from environmental hazards.
