- o In some cases, adding a fiber patch cord between the short cable and the equipment can bridge the gap, provided the total link loss remains within the design budget .

- o Leave service loops: Include extra fiber at endpoints to allow for future maintenance, re-termination, or equipment relocation .
- o Follow installation guidelines: Respect minimum bend radius, avoid sharp bends, and use proper conduits or innerducts to protect the fiber .

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o Document and label: Keep detailed records of cable lengths, splices, and routing to simplify troubleshooting and future upgrades .
