- o Fiber cleaning pens or sticks: Small, spinning cloth inside a pen for precise cleaning
- o Cleaning cassettes: Devices for cleaning both male and female connectors
- o Compressed air or canned air: Only for removing loose dust, never for wet cleaning Avoid using general-purpose cloths, tissues, or shirt sleeves, as they can leave fibers contaminated or scratched .

Cleaning Procedure

- o Inspect the connector using a fiber microscope to identify contamination .
- o Dry clean first with a lint-free wipe or cleaning pen to remove dust and debris .
- o Wet clean if necessary using approved alcohol-based solutions on a lint-free wipe, then dry immediately .
- o Re-inspect to ensure the end-face is free of particles before reconnecting .
- o Keep connectors capped when not in use to prevent contamination .

Best Practices

- o Always follow a "clean before connect" policy to prevent introducing contaminants into adapters, transceivers, or splicing equipment .
- o Avoid touching the fiber end-face with fingers or clothing .

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- o Maintain a routine cleaning schedule for high-density or field environments where dust and moisture are prevalent .
- o Check both ends of the fiber link, not just the patch cable, to ensure complete cleanliness . By consistently cleaning and inspecting fiber optic cables, you can prevent signal loss, reduce downtime, and extend the lifespan of your network equipment .
