Its primary use is to deter the addition by users of "dumb" switches to. Enabling this feature keeps track of permitted source MAC addresses and restricts the number of MACs that can use a specific port. The switch can

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- Allow only the following MAC addresses to connect to the wireless network: All devices in list of MAC addresses are allowed to connect to this SSID. All other devices are blocked.
