

The wiring conduit in the distribution box is blocked

To clear a blocked conduit, first locate the obstruction, then use tools like fish tape, steel wire, or a shop vacuum to remove debris, and for concrete blockages, carefully drill or open access points.

Identifying the Blockage

Start by determining the exact location of the blockage. You can insert a steel wire or fish tape into the conduit until it stops, then measure the distance from the entry point to estimate the blockage position . For more precise inspection, a borescope can help identify if the obstruction is debris, concrete, or a kink in the conduit .

Clearing Methods

- o Debris or small obstructions: Use a plumber's snake, fish tape, or shop vacuum to push, pull, or suck out the blockage. Move the tool back and forth to dislodge material .
- o Concrete or hard obstructions: If the conduit contains concrete, you may need a long masonry drill bit to carefully break it up. Ensure the drill can reach the blockage without damaging the conduit or surrounding structures .
- o Corners or bends: For blocked corners, pass a steel wire from both ends to meet at the bend, then use it to guide the wire through .

Safety and Testing

- o Always turn off power to the distribution box before attempting any work.
- o After clearing, test the conduit with a continuity tester to ensure there are no remaining obstructions or damage that could impede wire pulling .
- o If the conduit is severely blocked or inaccessible, consider opening an access point to remove debris safely and restore the pathway .

Preventive Tips

- o Ensure conduits are properly sealed during construction to prevent concrete or debris from entering.
- o Use conduit bodies or junction boxes at strategic points to allow easier access for future maintenance . By carefully locating the blockage, selecting the appropriate clearing method, and testing the conduit afterward, you can safely restore the wiring pathway in your distribution box.
