This design allows fast mass fusion splicing and is ideal for high-density applications, such as data centers or metro backbones, where large numbers of fibers need to be terminated efficiently .

Armored Fiber Optic Cables

Armored cables feature a metallic or non-metallic protective layer that shields fibers from physical damage, rodents, and moisture. They are commonly used in direct-buried installations or areas prone to mechanical stress, providing enhanced protection for critical outdoor networks .

All-Dielectric Self-Supporting (ADSS) Cables

ADSS cables are designed for aerial installations where the cable must be self-supporting without additional messenger wires. They include a central strength member and layers of aramid yarn or fiberglass for tensile strength, making them suitable for overhead power lines and long-span aerial deployments .

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Micro cables are ultra-compact, with diameters of 1-2 mm, allowing high fiber density in tight ducts or congested urban environments. They are flexible and lightweight, suitable for both short and long outdoor runs, especially in retrofits or space-constrained areas .
