

What is a horizontal cable tray

A horizontal cable tray is commonly referred to as a "straight section" or simply a "horizontal tray" in cable tray systems.

In cable tray systems, the straight sections form the main runs where cables are laid horizontally across ceilings, walls, or under floors, providing organized support and easy access for maintenance or expansion . Perforated trays and basket trays are also used horizontally, especially for lighter cables or network installations, providing flexibility and ease of cable management . Horizontal trays are often complemented with horizontal elbows to change direction on the same plane, and reducers to connect trays of different widths while maintaining a continuous horizontal run . These trays are typically mounted using trapeze hangers, wall brackets, or ceiling supports to ensure stability and proper load distribution .
