Common Materials

Galvanized Steel: This is widely used for its strength and durability. It can be pre-galvanized or hot-dip galvanized after fabrication to protect against corrosion. When cut in the field, exposed surfaces are often coated with a zinc-rich compound to maintain corrosion resistance . **Stainless Steel:** Ideal for harsh environments, stainless steel trays, often made from AISI 316L grade, provide excellent resistance to corrosion, including in areas with chemical exposure or high humidity. The addition of chromium and molybdenum enhances the protective surface layer . **Aluminum:** Lightweight and rust-resistant, aluminum trays are easy to install and offer good corrosion resistance due to a natural oxide layer. Aluminum is particularly suitable for environments where weight reduction is important . **Fiberglass-Reinforced Plastic (FRP/GRP):** These trays are made using pultrusion processes with polyester or vinyl ester resins. FRP trays are highly resistant to corrosion, making them suitable for chemical plants, marine environments, or other highly corrosive settings .

The choice of material depends on factors such as:

- o **Environmental exposure:** Humidity, chemicals, or saltwater may require stainless steel or FRP.
- o **Mechanical strength requirements:** Steel provides higher load capacity, while aluminum offers a lighter alternative.
