

Which type of indoor electrical distribution box is best

- o For areas exposed to dust, moisture, or chemicals, consider IP65-rated boxes with sealed doors and gaskets .

5. Specialized Options

- o Multi-gang boxes are useful for multiple devices in one location.
- o Fan-rated or ceiling fixture boxes are required for certain installations .
