

Which wire number should be used in the distribution box

Wire numbers typically combine letters and numbers, where letters indicate function (e.g., L for phase, N for neutral) and numbers indicate phase sequence or circuit number. Main circuit wires are usually thicker and color-coded red, blue, or yellow-green for easy identification.

Functional Grouping and Labeling

Wire numbers are also organized by functional grouping to simplify installation and maintenance:

- o Marking positions: Wires are labeled at both ends, near terminals, and along the cable where accessible.
- o Grouping by function: Power supply, load circuits, control circuits, and protective devices are grouped logically.
- o Label durability: Use strong materials like vinyl or polyester to ensure labels remain legible over time.
